


### Château de Castanet

The Château is on Castanet lands, meaning "chestnut" in Occitan. They are crossed by the Regordane Way and the via soteirana.

# Description

The Château was built in the late 16th century and used by the Isarn family for two centuries. During the French Revolution, it was sold as a property of the state. It was declared a listed historical building in the 1960s and thus saved from a watery grave when the EDF dam was built. The Château reopened to the public in 2006 after being completely restored following a fire. Today, it houses a permanent exhibition on the region's history as well as temporary exhibitions by artists and artisans.
