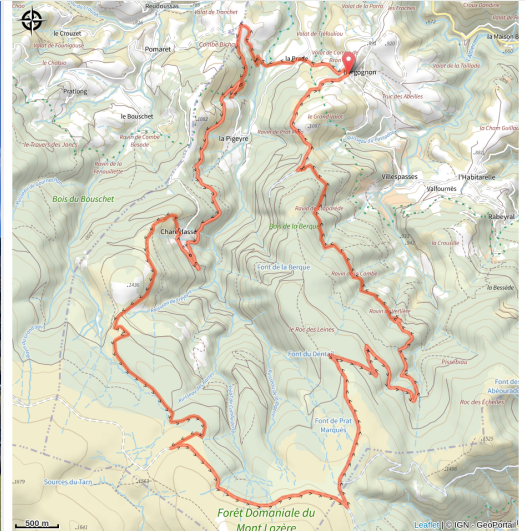

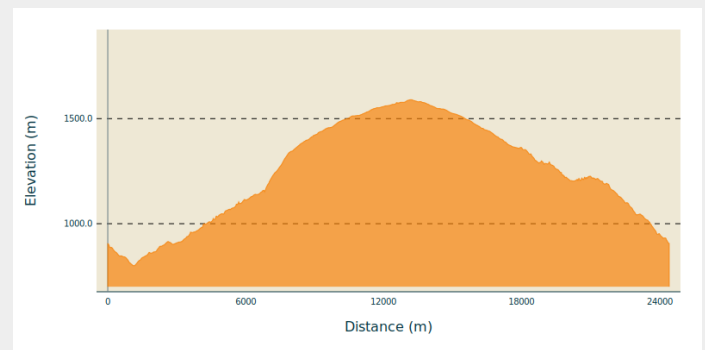

Signposts will guide you all along this route. In the description below, the signposted place names and/or directions are given in **bold italics** between quotation marks :

From “**Bergognon**” walk to “**Les Quatre Chemins**”. At “**Les Quatre Chemins**”, turn left to “**Chareylasse**”. At “**Chareylasse**”, continue straight to “**Route forestière**” via “**Chareylasse**”. At “**Route forestière**”, turn left to “**Le Grand Clapier 1548m**”. At “**Le Grand Clapier 1548m**”, return to “**Bergognon**” via “**Le Grand Clapier 1540m**” and “**Bois de la Berque**”.

This hike is taken from the guidebook **Mont Lozère - Pays des sources de la Margeride au lac de Villefort en Cévennes** published by the Pôle de pleine nature du Mont Lozère.
